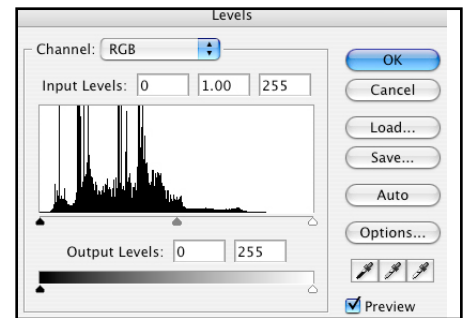

IMAGE ADJUSTMENT

Often when we open an image in Photoshop for the first time we need to make some adjustments to the tonal range of the image. The most effective way to do this in the levels dialogue box.

1. Open the three images 'Levels To Change' and save them to your folder.
2. You will see that the image Levels To Change 1 has a green cast and is lacking in contrast. Ensure that the info palette is visible and open the levels dialogue box **image > adjustments > levels (apple L)**.
3. Correct the tonal balance by adjusting the levels- bring the sliders to just within the 'foot of the mountain'
4. You will need to set the black point, white point and mid grey point on the image as discussed.
5. If the image still has a colour cast, make the final adjustments in **image > adjustments > colour balance**. Once you are satisfied save your image as 'LEVELS ADJUSTED 1'.
6. Open up an A4 image at 150ppi and place both 'LEVELS TO CHANGE' & 'LEVELS ADJUSTED' sided by side as shown below.
7. Place your name on the image and print for your folder.
8. Work on the other two images in the same way and print before and after versions as below.

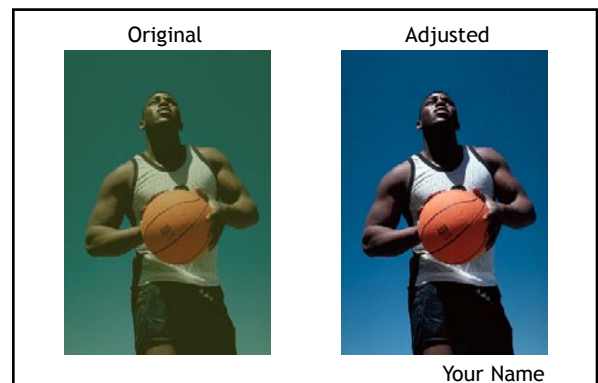
